THE GREAT AMERICAN ECLIPSE On Monday, Aug. 21, the Great American Eclipse will be visible in our area.

This is the first total solar eclipse visible in the U.S. in forty years.

It reaches maximum coverage at 1:20 p.m. locally, and can only be safely viewed with eclipse viewing glasses, which the library will be giving away thanks to a grant from NASA @ My Library program. Stop at the Readers' Services desk on the first floor starting August 1, to receive your free pair of eclipse glasses.
